group to Instagram! It's a work in progress to make all the social media accounts link so stay tuned...

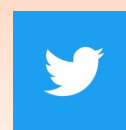

Celicia obtained her Bachelor of Science in Nursing at Florida State University in 2007 and worked on an acute pediatrics unit at Arnold Palmer Hospital in Orlando, Florida for 5 years before moving to Maryland and working as a Pediatric Nurse Practitioner role in an outpatient pediatric GI clinic in 2012. She is the Pediatric Liver Transplant Coordinator at Johns Hopkins Hospital, Division of Pediatric Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Nutrition. Currently, Celicia is attending Johns Hopkins University School of Nursing. For her capstone doctoral project, Celicia is focusing on bridging the gap in formal Nurse Practitioner education and specialty preparation by developing, implementing and evaluating an online pediatric GI NP education program that is based on the results of a needs assessment survey (which has been sent to the APGNN members). The 10 module program comes with a pre-test and post-test to evaluate an increase in specialized knowledge gained from the program. A program evaluation is also included to aid in future development of the program in various formats (fellowship, boot camps, online programs, webinars etc).
